DCPL49 - FIRST LEVEL OF THE ACADEMIC DEGREE COURSE IN TROMBONE

Program learning outcomes	<p>At the end of the First Level of the Academic Degree in Trombone, students acquire the techniques and the specific skills that allow them to concretely realize their artistic idea. For this purpose, particular emphasis is given to the study of the most representative instrument repertoire - including the ensemble - and its related performance practice, also with the aim of developing the student's ability to interact within differently composed musical groups. These goals are also achieved by promoting the development of the memory and auditory perceptual abilities and by acquiring specific knowledge relating to the music organizational, compositional and analytical models and their interaction.</p> <p>A particular focus is dedicated to acquiring appropriate postural and emotional control techniques. At the end of the three-year period, students own an in-depth knowledge of the general stylistic, historical and aesthetic aspects and those related to their composition specialization. With reference to the features of the course, students acquire appropriate improvisation techniques. Learning outcomes consist also in developing specific skills in music informatics and learning a second EU language.</p>




FINAL EXAMINATION

The Final Examination Thesis, approved by a supervisor, can be of 3 types:

- a) Musicological thesis. It consists in a written text of at least 70 pages signed by the supervisor/s and delivered to the Secretariat at least 20 days before the date of the final examination.
- b) Executive thesis, whose program must be delivered to the Secretariat at least 20 days before the date of the final examination. It consists of performing at least 30 minutes of songs - possibly of different genres and historical periods - and potentially accompanied by a written presentation (program note) and an oral presentation.
- c) Theoretical-executive thesis. It consists of performing at least 20 minutes of songs - possibly of different genres and historical periods - and at least 30 written pages. The program and the written text must also be delivered to the Secretariat at least 20 days before the date of the final examination.
